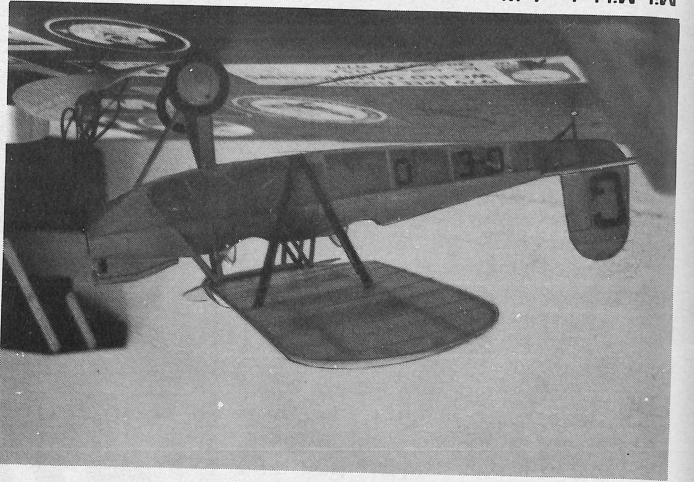


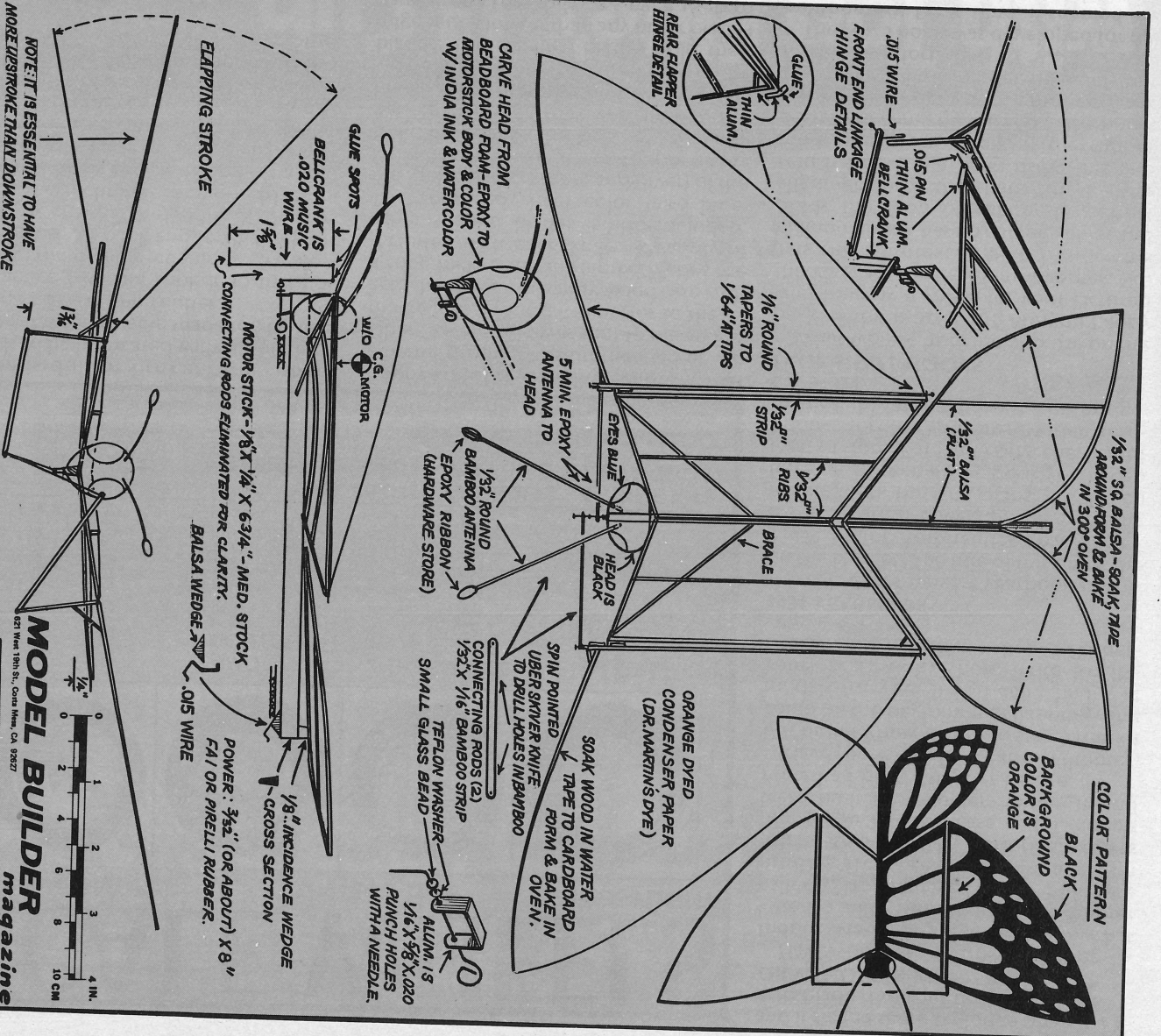
Mik Mikkelsen's Westland Widgeon has been around for several seasons. Covering is dyed condenser paper. Photo by Bob Warren.

The other end of the track. The knife blade is pushed down through the rubber strip to be cut. Start to strip the 1/4-inch rubber first. The carrier should be positioned so that the white line on the front of the carrier is pointing down at the middle of the track. The rubber will be cut approximately in the middle. The block is held in the left hand (if you are right handed) and the rubber is pulled through the stripper slowly and smoothly about 6" at a time. You may wish to attach the stripper to a table top with a large C-clamp so that both hands are free to pull the rubber.
